World Day of Prayer for Vocations April 25, 2021

The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity), secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life. 2021 marks the 58th Anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

This weekend is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations! There is a popular hymn by Dan Schutte called "Here I Am Lord". This hymn gives a good summary of what the attitude and response of each Christian and Prophet referred to in Sacred Scripture has been! "Here I am Lord. Is it I, Lord? I have heard you calling in the night. I will go Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart."

Each person is singularly and uniquely created by God and endowed with special gifts. God calls everyone to use their gifts for the benefit of others and for building up his Kingdom, the community of faith. Everyone has the gift of a vocation in which they find the fulfillment of the meaning and purpose of their lives.
